

Back to In-person Sunday school—Mud Creek

When will Children’s Sunday school begin?

Initially, we will begin offering Sunday school for children in preschool (ages 3 and up) through 4th grade twice a month on the 2nd and 3rd Sundays beginning Oct 11. (Oct 11 & 18; Nov. 8 & 11) Both the 9:00 am and 10:30 am services will be offered. Our G56 group will continue to worship in service at this time.

How long will class be?

We will follow the schedule of our current worship services that are forty to forty-five minutes. This follows recommendations to limit the length of time groups are together. A longer duration equates to greater risk. It also allows for time between classes to clean high touch areas.

Where do the children start class?

Families will check in their children in the education wing before worship services start. There will be a table to check in and a temperature check in the education wing. There will be no Children’s Moment in the regular worship service at any service. We ask that each family only send healthy children to Sunday school and follow the screening check for symptoms prior to check in.

Are masks required?

Yes, currently Marion County requires masks for children ages 3 and up. A mask protects others from any virus you might unknowingly carry. We support the CDC recommendation for use.

What about shared supplies?

Early concerns centered on the spread of COVID-19 on surfaces. We have put together separate bags of basic supplies that will be labeled with children’s names to use each week. All other shared supplies will be cleaned between uses.

What precautions are being taken during class?

Children that are not siblings will be socially distanced at tables and in carpeted areas. Weather permitting, some of class may move outdoors, so please dress appropriately. Shared toys and manipulatives will be limited and cleaned between services. Tables will be wiped down between services.

Will there be fellowship after services?

Community is at the heart of church but it is also a good vehicle for virus transmission. If before or after worship you wish to greet fellow members, please maintain social distancing and avoid embraces or handshakes.
